SLDA Initiatives



Regional Community Garden

Major work on the garden has been completed but this is an ongoing project. Garden signage is now being prepared for the site and more work is being planned to more clearly designate plot occupants. Use of the garden is restricted to SLDA members. There are 42 plots 15 ft by 60 ft and 20 raised garden boxes 12 ft by 4 ft. Each member is restricted to either one (1) plot or one (1) garden box.

With exception of fertilizer, boxes are ready for planting. Potting soil and lime were added last fall. Some lime was added to all plots last fall but more may be necessary. Garden plots will be tilled by SLDA tractor again this year. Tilling will be done lengthwise to ensure adjoining plots are not disturbed.

***All those now using the garden are reminded to renew SLDA membership to retain their plot for this year.
